Counties that are white represent those without a 2009 program. These white counties are primarily located in the eastern United States, including Maryland, Delaware, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana, Arkansas, Tennessee, Kentucky, West Virginia, and Maryland. The map also includes insets for Alaska and Hawaii, both of which are white, indicating they do not have a 2009 program.
